

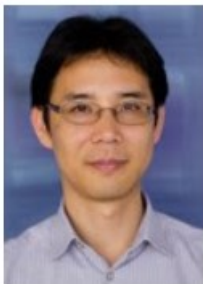

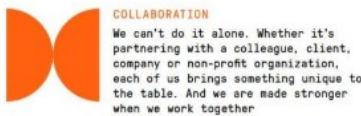

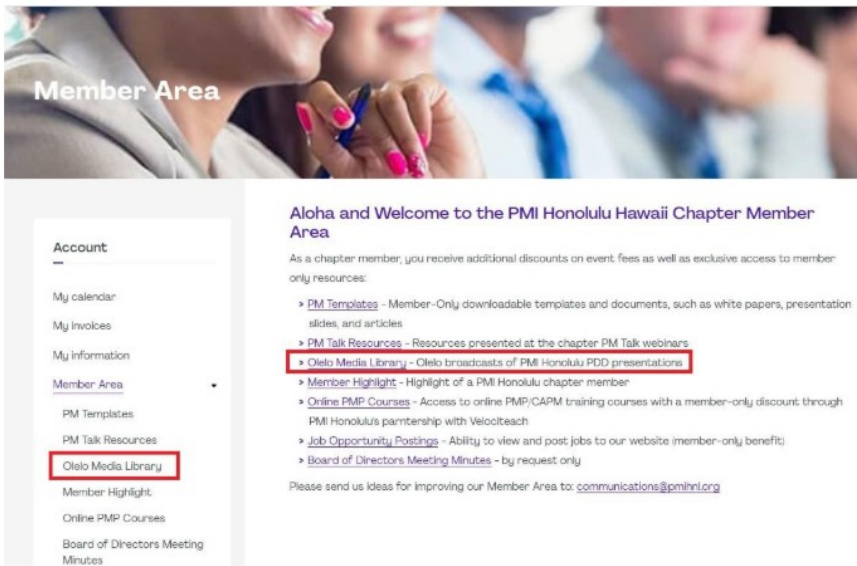

We would like to share with our membership and Project Management Professional (PMP) candidates an important update from PMI's CEO, Sunil Prashara, in regards to COVID-19. Sunil recently announced via LinkedIn that the launch of the new PMP® exam will be postponed until January 2, 2021. More information is available on the PMI website. This is a very important news to all of us as PMI recognizes the ongoing crisis and we are committed to working alongside with our members, vendors and partners.

We have decided to move our upcoming April PMP Exam Prep course to an online platform and will make necessary accommodations so candidates can prepare accordingly prior to the exam change in Jan 2021. Some valuable feedback was received on other training and professional development needs from our membership and to implement that feedback, we will look to host a Program Management Professional (PgMP), Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP), and other professional development workshops soon. By supporting each other through this difficult time, we can keep learning, growing and moving forward.

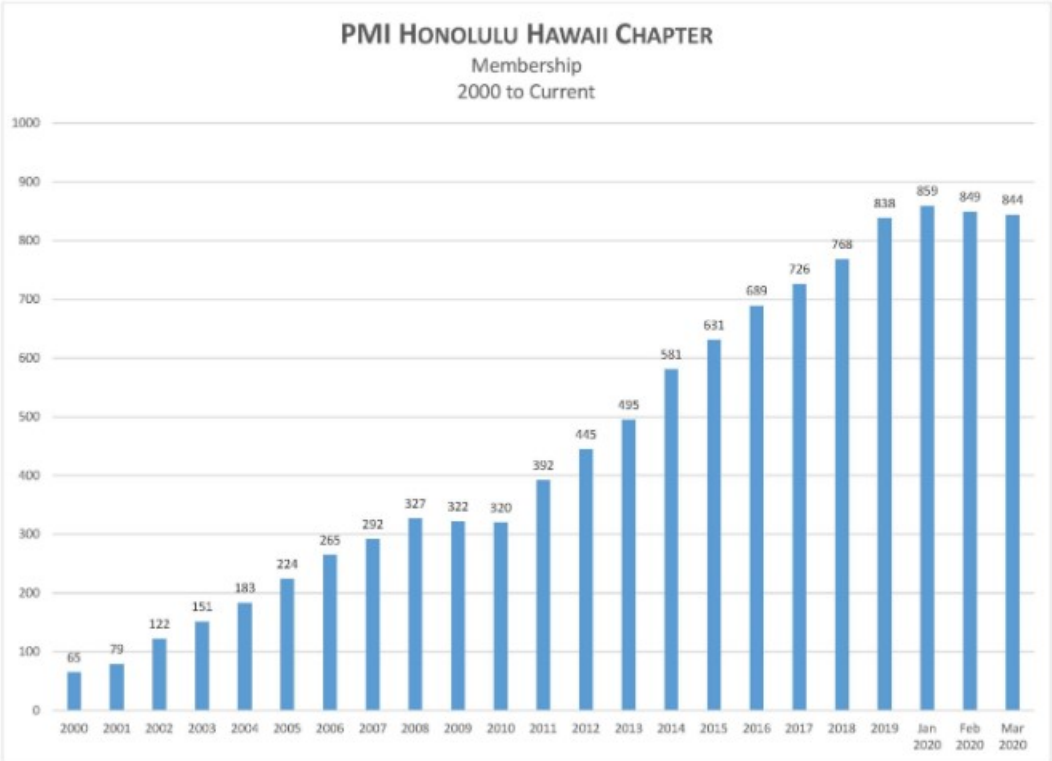
